## **Securing the City**

¹Now it came to pass, when the wall was built, and I had set up the doors, and the porters and the singers and the Levites were appointed, ²that I gave my brother Hanani, and Hananiah the governor of the castle, charge over Jerusalem; for he was a faithful man, and feared God above many. ³And I said unto them: `Let not the gates of Jerusalem be opened until the sun be hot; and while they stand

on guard, let them shut the doors, and bar ye them; and let watches be appointed of the inhabitants of Jerusalem, every one in his watch, and every one to be over against his house.'

- <sup>4</sup>Now the city was wide and large; but the people were few therein, and the houses were not builded.
- <sup>5</sup>And my God put into my heart to gather together the nobles, and the rulers, and the people, that they might be reckoned by genealogy. And I found the book of the genealogy of them that came up at the first, and I found written therein:
- <sup>6</sup>These are the children of the province, that went up out of the captivity of those that had been carried away, whom Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon had carried away, and that returned unto Jerusalem and to Judah, every one unto his city; 7who came with Zerubbabel, Jeshua, Nehemiah, Azariah, Raamiah, Nahamani, Mordecai, Bilshan, Mispereth, Bigvai, Nehum, Baanah. The number of the men of the people of Israel: 8The children of Parosh, two thousand a hundred and seventy and two. 9The children of Shephatiah, three hundred seventy and two. 10 The children of Arah, six hundred fifty and two. 11The children of Pahath-moab, of the children of Jeshua and Joab, two thousand and eight hundred and eighteen. 12The children of Elam, a thousand two hundred fifty and four. 13The children of Zattu, eight hundred forty and five. 14The children of Zaccai, seven hundred and threescore. 15The children of Binnui, six hundred forty and eight. 16The children of Bebai, six hundred twenty and eight. 17The children of Azgad, two thousand three hundred twenty and two. 18The children of Adonikam, six hundred threescore and seven. 19The children of Bigvai, two thousand threescore and seven. 20The children of Adin, six hundred fifty and five. 21The children of Ater, of Hezekiah, ninety and eight. 22The children of Hashum, three hundred twenty and eight. <sup>23</sup>The children of Bezai, three hundred twenty and four, <sup>24</sup>The children of Hariph, a hundred and twelve, <sup>25</sup>The children of Gibeon, ninety and five, <sup>26</sup>The men of Beth-lehem and Netophah, a hundred fourscore and eight. <sup>27</sup>The men of Anathoth, a hundred twenty and eight. <sup>28</sup>The men of Beth-azmaveth, forty and two. <sup>29</sup>The men of Kiriath-jearim, Chephirah, and Beeroth, seven hundred forty and three. 30The men of Ramah and Geba, six hundred twenty and one. 31The men of Michmas, a hundred and twenty and two. 32The men of Beth-el and Ai, a hundred twenty and three. 33The men of the other Nebo, fifty and two. 34The children of the other Elam, a thousand two hundred fifty and four. 35The children of Harim, three hundred and twenty. <sup>36</sup>The children of Jericho, three hundred forty and five. <sup>37</sup>The children of Lod, Hadid, and Ono, seven hundred twenty and one. <sup>38</sup>The children of Senaah, three thousand nine hundred and thirty.
- <sup>39</sup>The priests: The children of Jedaiah, of the house of Jeshua, nine hundred seventy and three. <sup>40</sup>The children of Immer, a thousand fifty and two. <sup>41</sup>The children of Pashhur, a thousand two hundred forty and seven. <sup>42</sup>The children of Harim, a thousand and seventeen.
- <sup>43</sup>The Levites: the children of Jeshua, of Kadmiel, of the children of Hodeiah, seventy and four. <sup>44</sup>The singers: the children of Asaph, a hundred forty and eight. <sup>45</sup>The porters: the children of Shallum, the children of Ater, the children of Talmon, the children of Akkub, the children of Hatita, the children of Shobai, a hundred thirty and eight.
- <sup>46</sup>The Nethinim: the children of Ziha, the children of Hasupha, the children of Tabbaoth; <sup>47</sup>the children of Keros, the children of Sia, the children of Padon; <sup>48</sup>the children of Lebanah, the children of Hagaba, the children of Salmai; <sup>49</sup>the children of Hanan, the children of Giddel, the children of Gahar; <sup>50</sup>the children of Reaiah, the children of Rezin, the children of Nekoda; <sup>51</sup>the children of Gazzam, the children

of Uzza, the children of Paseah; <sup>52</sup>the children of Besai, the children of Meunim, the children of Nephishesim; <sup>53</sup>the children of Bakbuk, the children of Hakupha, the children of Harhur; <sup>54</sup>the children of Bazlith, the children of Mehida, the children of Harsha; <sup>55</sup>the children of Barkos, the children of Sisera, the children of Temah; <sup>56</sup>the children of Neziah, the children of Hatipha.

- <sup>57</sup>The children of Solomon's servants: the children of Sotai, the children of Sophereth, the children of Perida; <sup>58</sup>the children of Jala, the children of Darkon, the children of Giddel; <sup>59</sup>the children of Shephatiah, the children of Hattil, the children of Pochereth-hazzebaim, the children of Amon.
- <sup>60</sup>All the Nethinim, and the children of Solomon's servants, were three hundred ninety and two.
- 61And these were they that went up from Tel-melah, Tel-harsha, Cherub, Addon, and Immer; but they could not tell their fathers' houses, nor their seed, whether they were of Israel: 62the children of Delaiah, the children of Tobiah, the children of Nekoda, six hundred forty and two.
- <sup>63</sup>And of the priests: the children of Habaiah, the children of Hakkoz, the children of Barzillai, who took a wife of the daughters of Barzillai the Gileadite, and was called after their name. <sup>64</sup>These sought their register, that is, the genealogy, but it was not found; therefore were they deemed polluted and put from the priesthood. <sup>65</sup>And the Tirshatha said unto them, that they should not eat of the most holy things, till there stood up a priest with Urim and Thummim.
- 66The whole congregation together was forty and two thousand three hundred and threescore, 67beside their men-servants and their maid-servants, of whom there were seven thousand three hundred thirty and seven; and they had two hundred forty and five singing men and singing women. 68[ Their horses were seven hundred thirty and six; their mules, two hundred forty and five;] 69their camels, four hundred thirty and five; their asses, six thousand seven hundred and twenty.

### Offerings by the Exiles

(Exodus 38:21–31; Ezra 2:68–70)

70And some from among the heads of fathers' houses gave unto the work. The Tirshatha gave to the treasury a thousand darics of gold, fifty basins, five hundred and thirty priests' tunics. 71And some of the heads of fathers' houses gave into the treasury of the work twenty thousand darics of gold, and two thousand and two hundred pounds of silver. 72And that which the rest of the people gave was twenty thousand darics of gold, and two thousand pounds of silver, and threescore and seven priests' tunics.

73So the priests, and the Levites, and the porters, and the singers, and some of the people, and the Nethinim, and all Israel, dwelt in their cities. And when the seventh month was come, and the children of Israel were in their cities,
