## Wine Is a Mocker

- <sup>1</sup>Wine is a mocker, strong drink is riotous; And whosoever reeleth thereby is not wise.
- <sup>2</sup>The terror of a king is as the roaring of a lion: He that provoketh him to anger forfeiteth his life.
- <sup>3</sup>It is an honour for a man to keep aloof from strife; But every fool will be snarling.
- <sup>4</sup>The sluggard will not plow when winter setteth in; Therefore he shall beg in harvest, and have nothing.
- <sup>5</sup>Counsel in the heart of man is like deep water; But a man of understanding will draw it out.
- <sup>6</sup>Most men will proclaim every one his own goodness; But a faithful man who can find?
- <sup>7</sup>He that walketh in his integrity as a just man, Happy are his children after him.
- 8A king that sitteth on the throne of judgment Scattereth away all evil with his eyes.

- 9Who can say: 'I have made my heart clean, I am pure from my sin'?
- **10**Divers weights, and divers measures, Both of them alike are abomination to the LORD.
- 11Even a child is known by his doings, Whether his work be pure, and whether it be right.
- 12The hearing ear, and the seeing eye, The LORD hath made even both of them.
- <sup>13</sup>Love not sleep, lest thou come to poverty; Open thine eyes, and thou shalt have bread in plenty.
- 14It is bad, it is bad', saith the buyer; But when he is gone his way, then he boasteth.
- 15There is gold, and a multitude of rubies; But the lips of knowledge are a precious jewel.
- <sup>16</sup>Take his garment that is surety for a stranger; And hold him in pledge that is surety for an alien woman.
- 17Bread of falsehood is sweet to a man; But afterwards his mouth shall be filled with gravel.
- 18 Every purpose is established by counsel; And with good advice carry on war.
- <sup>19</sup>He that goeth about as a talebearer revealeth secrets; Therefore meddle not with him that openeth wide his lips.
- <sup>20</sup>Whoso curseth his father or his mother, His lamp shall be put out in the blackest darkness.
- <sup>21</sup>An estate may be gotten hastily at the beginning; But the end thereof shall not be blessed.
- <sup>22</sup>Say not thou: 'I will requite evil'; Wait for the LORD, and He will save thee.
- <sup>23</sup>Divers weights are an abomination to the LORD; And a false balance is not good.
- <sup>24</sup>A man's goings are of the LORD; How then can man look to his way?
- <sup>25</sup>It is a snare to a man rashly to say: 'Holy', And after vows to make inquiry.
- <sup>26</sup>A wise king sifteth the wicked, And turneth the wheel over them.
- <sup>27</sup>The spirit of man is the lamp of the LORD, Searching all the inward parts.
- <sup>28</sup>Mercy and truth preserve the king; And his throne is upheld by mercy.
- <sup>29</sup>The glory of young men is their strength; And the beauty of old men is the hoary head.
- 30Sharp wounds cleanse away evil; So do stripes that reach the inward parts.
