## **Babylon Is Fallen**

(Revelation 18:1–8)

- <sup>1</sup>The burden of the wilderness of the sea. As whirlwinds in the South sweeping on, It cometh from the wilderness, from a dreadful land.
- <sup>2</sup>A grievous vision is declared unto me: 'The treacherous dealer dealeth treacherously, and the spoiler spoileth. Go up, O Elam! besiege, O Media! All the sighing thereof have I made to cease.'
- <sup>3</sup>Therefore are my loins filled with convulsion; Pangs have taken hold upon me, as the pangs of a woman in travail; I am bent so that I cannot hear; I am affrighted so that I cannot see.
- <sup>4</sup>My heart is bewildered, terror hath overwhelmed me; The twilight that I longed for hath been turned for me into trembling.
- <sup>5</sup>They prepare the table, they light the lamps, they eat, they drink—'Rise up, ye princes, anoint the shield.'
- <sup>6</sup>For thus hath the Lord said unto me: Go, set a watchman; let him declare what he seeth!
- 7And when he seeth a troop, horsemen by pairs, A troop of asses, a troop of camels, He shall hearken diligently with much heed.

- <sup>8</sup>And he cried as a lion: 'Upon the watch-tower, O Lord, I stand continually in the daytime, And I am set in my ward all the nights.'
- <sup>9</sup>And, behold, there came a troop of men, horsemen by pairs. And he spoke and said: 'Fallen, fallen is Babylon; And all the graven images of her gods are broken unto the ground.'
- <sup>10</sup>O thou my threshing, and the winnowing of my floor, That which I have heard from the LORD of hosts, The God of Israel, have I declared unto you.

#### The Burden against Edom

(Isaiah 34:5–17)

- 11 The burden of Dumah. One calleth unto me out of Seir: 'Watchman, what of the night?' Watchman, what of the night?'
- 12The watchman said: 'The morning cometh, and also the night—If ye will inquire, inquire ye; return, come.'

#### The Burden against Arabia

- 13The burden upon Arabia. In the thickets in Arabia shall ye lodge, O ye caravans of Dedanites.
- <sup>14</sup>Unto him that is thirsty bring ye water! The inhabitants of the land of Tema did meet the fugitive with his bread.
- 15 For they fled away from the swords, from the drawn sword, And from the bent bow, and from the grievousness of war.
- 16For thus hath the Lord said unto me: 'Within a year, according to the years of a hireling, and all the glory of Kedar shall fail; 17 and the residue of the number of the archers, the mighty men of the children of Kedar, shall be diminished; for the LORD, the God of Israel, hath spoken it.'
