#### **True Riches**

(1 Timothy 6:17–19; James 5:1–6)

#### Saying 7

- <sup>1</sup>When thou sittest to eat with a ruler, Consider well him that is before thee;
- <sup>2</sup>And put a knife to thy throat, If thou be a man given to appetite.
- <sup>3</sup>Be not desirous of his dainties; Seeing they are deceitful food.

### Saying 8

- 4Weary not thyself to be rich; Cease from thine own wisdom.
- 5Wilt thou set thine eyes upon it? it is gone; For riches certainly make themselves wings, Like an eagle that flieth toward heaven.

### Saying 9

- <sup>6</sup>Eat thou not the bread of him that hath an evil eye, Neither desire thou his dainties;
- <sup>7</sup>For as one that hath reckoned within himself, so is he: 'Eat and drink', saith he to thee; But his heart is not with thee.
- <sup>8</sup>The morsel which thou hast eaten shalt thou vomit up, And lose thy sweet words.

## Saying 10

<sup>9</sup>Speak not in the ears of a fool; For he will despise the wisdom of thy words.

## Saying 11

- 10Remove not the ancient landmark; And enter not into the fields of the fatherless;
- <sup>11</sup>For their Redeemer is strong; He will plead their cause with thee.

# Saying 12

12 Apply thy heart unto instruction, And thine ears to the words of knowledge.

### Saying 13

- 13Withhold not correction from the child; For though thou beat him with the rod, he will not die.
- 14Thou beatest him with the rod, And wilt deliver his soul from the nether-world.

## Saying 14

- 15My son, if thy heart be wise, My heart will be glad, even mine;
- 16Yea, my reins will rejoice, When thy lips speak right things.

## Saying 15

- 17Let not thy heart envy sinners, But be in the fear of the LORD all the day;
- 18 For surely there is a future; And thy hope shall not be cut off.

## Saying 16

- <sup>19</sup>Hear thou, my son, and be wise, And guide thy heart in the way.
- <sup>20</sup>Be not among winebibbers; Among gluttonous eaters of flesh;
- <sup>21</sup>For the drunkard and the glutton shall come to poverty; And drowsiness shall clothe a man with rags.

## Saying 17

- <sup>22</sup>Hearken unto thy father that begot thee, And despise not thy mother when she is old.
- 23Buy the truth, and sell it not; Also wisdom, and instruction, and understanding.
- <sup>24</sup>The father of the righteous will greatly rejoice; And he that begetteth a wise child will have joy of him.
- 25Let thy father and thy mother be glad, And let her that bore thee rejoice.

# Saying 18

- <sup>26</sup>My son, give me thy heart, And let thine eyes observe my ways.
- <sup>27</sup>For a harlot is a deep ditch; And an alien woman is a narrow pit.
- <sup>28</sup>She also lieth in wait as a robber, And increaseth the faithless among men.

# Saying 19

- <sup>29</sup>Who crieth: 'Woe'? who: 'Alas'? Who hath contentions? who hath raving? Who hath wounds without cause? Who hath redness of eyes?
- 30 They that tarry long at the wine; They that go to try mixed wine.

- <sup>31</sup>Look not thou upon the wine when it is red, When it giveth its colour in the cup, When it glideth down smoothly;
- 32At the last it biteth like a serpent, And stingeth like a basilisk.
- 33Thine eyes shall behold strange things, And thy heart shall utter confused things.
- <sup>34</sup>Yea, thou shalt be as he that lieth down in the midst of the sea, Or as he that lieth upon the top of a mast.
- 35They have struck me, and I felt it not, They have beaten me, and I knew it not; When shall I awake? I will seek it yet again.'
