ACTS 26

ACTS 26:1

1 ¶ Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Thou art permitted to speak for thyself. Then Paul stretched forth the hand, and answered for himself:

ACTS 26:2

2 I think myself happy, king Agrippa, because I shall answer for myself this day before thee touching all the things whereof I am accused of the Jews:

ACTS 26:3

3 Especially *because I know* thee to be expert in all customs and questions which are among the Jews: wherefore I beseech thee to hear me patiently.

ACTS 26:4

4 My manner of life from my youth, which was at the first among mine own nation at Jerusalem, know all the Jews;

ACTS 26:5

5 Which knew me from the beginning, if they would testify, that after the most straitest sect of our religion I lived a Pharisee.

ACTS 26:6

6 And now I stand and am judged for the hope of the promise made of God unto our fathers:

ACTS 26:7

7 Unto which *promise* our twelve tribes, instantly serving *God* day and night, hope to come. For which hope's sake, king Agrippa, I am accused of the Jews.

ACTS 26:8

8 Why should it be thought a thing incredible with you, that God should raise the dead?

ACTS 26:9

9 I verily thought with myself, that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth.

ACTS 26:10

10 Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: and many of the saints did I shut up in prison, having received authority from the chief priests; and when they were put to death, I gave my voice against *them*.

ACTS 26:11

11 And I punished them oft in every synagogue, and compelled *them* to blaspheme; and being exceedingly mad against them, I persecuted *them* even unto strange cities.

ACTS 26:12

12 Whereupon as I went to Damascus with authority and commission from the chief priests,

ACTS 26:13

13 At midday, O king, I saw in the way a light from heaven, above the brightness of the sun, shining round about me and them which journeyed with me.

ACTS 26:14

14 And when we were all fallen to the earth, I heard a voice speaking unto me, and saying in the Hebrew tongue, _Saul, _Saul, _why _persecutest thou me? *it is* _hard for thee to _kick _against the _pricks.

ACTS 26:15

15 And I said, Who art thou, Lord? And he said, I _am _Jesus _whom thou _persecutest.

ACTS 26:16

16 But _rise, and _stand upon thy _feet: for I have _appeared unto thee for _this purpose, to _make thee a _minister and a _witness _both of these things _which thou hast _seen, and of those things in the _which I will _appear unto thee;

ACTS 26:17

17 _Delivering thee from the _people, and *from* the _Gentiles, unto _whom _now I _send thee,

ACTS 26:18

18 To _open their _eyes, *and* to _turn *them* from _darkness to _light, and *from* the _power of _Satan unto _God, that they may _receive _forgiveness of _sins, and _inheritance _among them which are _sanctified by _faith that is in me.

ACTS 26:19

19 Whereupon, O king Agrippa, I was not disobedient unto the heavenly vision:

ACTS 26:20

20 But shewed first unto them of Damascus, and at Jerusalem, and throughout all the coasts of Judaea, and *then* to the Gentiles, that they should repent and turn to God, and do works meet for repentance.

ACTS 26:21

21 For these causes the Jews caught me in the temple, and went about to kill me.

ACTS 26:22

22 Having therefore obtained help of God, I continue unto this day, witnessing both to small and great, saying none other things than those which the prophets and Moses did say should come:

ACTS 26:23

23 That Christ should suffer, *and* that he should be the first that should rise from the dead, and should shew light unto the people, and to the Gentiles.

ACTS 26:24

24 And as he thus spake for himself, Festus said with a loud voice, Paul, thou art beside thyself; much learning doth make thee mad.

ACTS 26:25

25 But he said, I am not mad, most noble Festus; but speak forth the words of truth and soberness.

ACTS 26:26

26 For the king knoweth of these things, before whom also I speak freely: for I am persuaded that none of these things are hidden from him; for this thing was not done in a corner.

ACTS 26:27

27 King Agrippa, believest thou the prophets? I know that thou believest.

ACTS 26:28

28 Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian.

ACTS 26:29

29 And Paul said, I would to God, that not only thou, but also all that hear me this day, were both almost, and altogether such as I am, except these bonds.

ACTS 26:30

30 And when he had thus spoken, the king rose up, and the governor, and Bernice, and they that sat with them:

ACTS 26:31

31 And when they were gone aside, they talked between themselves, saying, This man doeth nothing worthy of death or of bonds.
