ECCLESIASTES 7:1

1 \P A good name *is* better than precious ointment; and the day of death than the day of one's birth.

ECCLESIASTES 7:2

2 *It is* better to go to the house of mourning, than to go to the house of feasting: for that *is* the end of all men; and the living will lay *it* to his heart.

ECCLESIASTES 7:3

3 Sorrow *is* better than laughter: for by the sadness of the countenance the heart is made better.

ECCLESIASTES 7:4

4 The heart of the wise *i*s in the house of mourning; but the heart of fools *i*s in the house of mirth.

ECCLESIASTES 7:5

5 It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise, than for a man to hear the song of fools.

ECCLESIASTES 7:6

6 For as the crackling of thorns under a pot, so *is* the laughter of the fool: this also *is* vanity.

ECCLESIASTES 7:7

7 ¶ Surely oppression maketh a wise man mad; and a gift destroyeth the heart.

ECCLESIASTES 7:8

8 Better *is* the end of a thing than the beginning thereof: *and* the patient in spirit *is* better than the proud in spirit.

ECCLESIASTES 7:9

9 Be not hasty in thy spirit to be angry: for anger resteth in the bosom of fools.

ECCLESIASTES 7:10

10 Say not thou, What is *the cause* that the former days were better than these? for thou dost not enquire wisely concerning this.

ECCLESIASTES 7:11

11 ¶ Wisdom *is* good with an inheritance: and *by it there is* profit to them that see the sun.

ECCLESIASTES 7:12

12 For wisdom *is* a defence, *and* money *is* a defence: but the excellency of knowledge *is, that* wisdom giveth life to them that have it.

ECCLESIASTES 7:13

13 Consider the work of God: for who can make *that* straight, which he hath made crooked?

ECCLESIASTES 7:14

14 In the day of prosperity be joyful, but in the day of adversity consider: God also hath set the one over against the other, to the end that man should find nothing after him.

ECCLESIASTES 7:15

15 All *things* have I seen in the days of my vanity: there is a just *man* that perisheth in his righteousness, and there is a wicked *man* that prolongeth *his life* in his wickedness.

ECCLESIASTES 7:16

16 Be not righteous over much; neither make thyself over wise: why shouldest thou destroy thyself?

ECCLESIASTES 7:17

17 Be not over much wicked, neither be thou foolish: why shouldest thou die before thy time?

ECCLESIASTES 7:18

18 *It is* good that thou shouldest take hold of this; yea, also from this withdraw not thine hand: for he that feareth God shall come forth of them all.

ECCLESIASTES 7:19

19 Wisdom strengtheneth the wise more than ten mighty *men* which are in the city.

ECCLESIASTES 7:20

20 For there is not a just man upon earth, that doeth good, and sinneth not.

ECCLESIASTES 7:21

21 Also take no heed unto all words that are spoken; lest thou hear thy servant curse thee:

ECCLESIASTES 7:22

22 For oftentimes also thine own heart knoweth that thou thyself likewise hast cursed others.

ECCLESIASTES 7:23

23 ¶ All this have I proved by wisdom: I said, I will be wise; but it was far from me.

ECCLESIASTES 7:24

24 That which is far off, and exceeding deep, who can find it out?

ECCLESIASTES 7:25

25 I applied mine heart to know, and to search, and to seek out wisdom, and the reason *of things*, and to know the wickedness of folly, even of foolishness *and* madness:

ECCLESIASTES 7:26

26 And I find more bitter than death the woman, whose heart *is* snares and nets, *and* her hands *as* bands: whoso pleaseth God shall escape from her; but the sinner shall be taken by her.

ECCLESIASTES 7:27

27 Behold, this have I found, saith the preacher, *counting* one by one, to find out the account:

ECCLESIASTES 7:28

Which yet my soul seeketh, but I find not: one man among a thousand have I found; but a woman among all those have I not found.

ECCLESIASTES 7:29

29 Lo, this only have I found, that God hath made man upright; but they have sought out many inventions.
