

## II CORINTHIANS 3

### II CORINTHIANS 3:1

1 ¶ Do we begin again to commend ourselves? or need we, as some *others*, epistles of commendation to you, or *letters* of commendation from you?

### II CORINTHIANS 3:2

2 Ye are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read of all men:

### II CORINTHIANS 3:3

3 *Forasmuch as ye are* manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart.

### II CORINTHIANS 3:4

4 And such trust have we through Christ to God-ward:

### II CORINTHIANS 3:5

5 Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of ourselves; but our sufficiency *is* of God;

### II CORINTHIANS 3:6

6 ¶ Who also hath made us able ministers of the new testament; not of the letter, but of the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit giveth life.

### II CORINTHIANS 3:7

7 But if the ministration of death, written *and* engraven in stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not stedfastly behold the face of Moses for the glory of his countenance; which *glory* was to be done away:

### II CORINTHIANS 3:8

8 How shall not the ministration of the spirit be rather glorious?

### II CORINTHIANS 3:9

9 For if the ministration of condemnation *be* glory, much more doth the ministration of righteousness exceed in glory.

### II CORINTHIANS 3:10

10 For even that which was made glorious had no glory in this respect, by reason of the glory that excelleth.

### II CORINTHIANS 3:11

11 For if that which is done away was glorious, much more that which remaineth *is* glorious.

II CORINTHIANS 3:12

12 ¶ Seeing then that we have such hope, we use great plainness of speech:

II CORINTHIANS 3:13

13 And not as Moses, *which* put a vail over his face, that the children of Israel could not stedfastly look to the end of that which is abolished:

II CORINTHIANS 3:14

14 But their minds were blinded: for until this day remaineth the same vail untaken away in the reading of the old testament; which *vail* is done away in Christ.

II CORINTHIANS 3:15

15 But even unto this day, when Moses is read, the vail is upon their heart.

II CORINTHIANS 3:16

16 Nevertheless when it shall turn to the Lord, the vail shall be taken away.

II CORINTHIANS 3:17

17 Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord *is*, there *is* liberty.

II CORINTHIANS 3:18

18 But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, *even* as by the Spirit of the Lord.
