JOHN 21

JOHN 21:1

1 \P After these things Jesus shewed himself again to the disciples at the sea of Tiberias; and on this wise shewed he *himself*.

JOHN 21:2

2 There were together Simon Peter, and Thomas called Didymus, and Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, and the *sons* of Zebedee, and two other of his disciples.

JOHN 21:3

3 Simon Peter saith unto them, I go a fishing. They say unto him, We also go with thee. They went forth, and entered into a ship immediately; and that night they caught nothing.

JOHN 21:4

4 But when the morning was now come, Jesus stood on the shore: but the disciples knew not that it was Jesus.

JOHN 21:5

5 Then Jesus saith unto them, <u>Children</u>, <u>have ye any meat?</u> They answered him, No.

JOHN 21:6

6 And he said unto them, <u>Cast the _net _on the _right _side of the _ship</u>, and ye shall _find. They cast therefore, and now they were not able to draw it for the multitude of fishes.

JOHN 21:7

7 Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved saith unto Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he girt *his* fisher's coat *unto him*, (for he was naked,) and did cast himself into the sea.

JOHN 21:8

8 And the other disciples came in a little ship; (for they were not far from land, but as it were two hundred cubits,) dragging the net with fishes.

JOHN 21:9

9 As soon then as they were come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid thereon, and bread.

JOHN 21:10

10 Jesus saith unto them, _Bring of the _fish _which ye have _now _caught.

JOHN 21:11

11 Simon Peter went up, and drew the net to land full of great fishes, an hundred and fifty and three: and for all there were so many, yet was not the net broken.

JOHN 21:12

12 Jesus saith unto them, <u>Come and _dine</u>. And none of the disciples durst ask him, Who art thou? knowing that it was the Lord.

JOHN 21:13

13 Jesus then cometh, and taketh bread, and giveth them, and fish likewise.

JOHN 21:14

14 This is now the third time that Jesus shewed himself to his disciples, after that he was risen from the dead.

JOHN 21:15

15 So when they had dined, Jesus saith to Simon Peter, <u>Simon</u>, *son* of Jonas, <u>lovest thou me more than these?</u> He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, <u>Feed my lambs</u>.

JOHN 21:16

16 He saith to him again the second time, _Simon, *son* of _Jonas, _lovest thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, _Feed my _sheep.

JOHN 21:17

17 He saith unto him the third time, <u>Simon</u>, *son* of <u>Jonas</u>, <u>lovest thou me</u>? Peter was grieved because he said unto him the third time, Lovest thou me? And he said unto him, Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, <u>Feed my sheep</u>.

JOHN 21:18

18 _Verily, _verily, I _say unto thee, _When thou _wast _young, thou _girdedst _thyself, and _walkedst _whither thou _wouldest: but _when thou shalt be _old, thou shalt _stretch _forth thy _hands, and _another shall _gird thee, and _carry *thee* _whither thou _wouldest not.

JOHN 21:19

19 This spake he, signifying by what death he should glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, _Follow me.

JOHN 21:20

20 Then Peter, turning about, seeth the disciple whom Jesus loved following; which also leaned on his breast at supper, and said, Lord, which is he that betrayeth thee?

JOHN 21:21

21 Peter seeing him saith to Jesus, Lord, and what shall this man do?

JOHN 21:22

22 Jesus saith unto him, _If I _will that he _tarry _till I _come, _what *is that* to thee? _follow _thou me.

JOHN 21:23

23 Then went this saying abroad among the brethren, that that disciple should not die: yet Jesus said not unto him, He shall not die; but, If I will that he tarry till I come, what *is that* to thee?

JOHN 21:24

24 This is the disciple which testifieth of these things, and wrote these things: and we know that his testimony is true.

JOHN 21:25

25 And there are also many other things which Jesus did, the which, if they should be written every one, I suppose that even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written. Amen.
