## LUKE 6:1

1 ¶ And it came to pass on the second sabbath after the first, that he went through the corn fields; and his disciples plucked the ears of corn, and did eat, rubbing *them* in *their* hands.

## LUKE 6:2

2 And certain of the Pharisees said unto them, Why do ye that which is not lawful to do on the sabbath days?

## LUKE 6:3

3 And Jesus answering them said, Have ye not *\_read \_so \_much as \_this, \_what \_David \_did, \_when \_himself was an \_hungred, and they \_which were with him;*

## LUKE 6:4

4 *\_How he \_went \_into the \_house of \_God, and did \_take and \_eat the \_shewbread, and \_gave \_also to them that were with him; which it is not \_lawful to \_eat but for the \_priests \_alone?*

## LUKE 6:5

5 And he said unto them, *That the \_Son of \_man is \_Lord \_also of the \_sabbath.*

## LUKE 6:6

6 And it came to pass also on another sabbath, that he entered into the synagogue and taught: and there was a man whose right hand was withered.

## LUKE 6:7

7 And the scribes and Pharisees watched him, whether he would heal on the sabbath day; that they might find an accusation against him.

## LUKE 6:8

8 But he knew their thoughts, and said to the man which had the withered hand, *\_Rise up, and \_stand forth in the \_midst.* And he arose and stood forth.

## LUKE 6:9

9 Then said Jesus unto them, *I will \_ask you \_one thing; Is it \_lawful on the \_sabbath days to \_do \_good, \_or to \_do \_evil? to \_save \_life, \_or to \_destroy it?*

## LUKE 6:10

10 And looking round about upon them all, he said unto the man, *\_Stretch \_forth thy \_hand.* And he did so: and his hand was restored whole as the other.

LUKE 6:11

11 And they were filled with madness; and communed one with another what they might do to Jesus.

LUKE 6:12

12 ¶ And it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God.

LUKE 6:13

13 And when it was day, he called *unto him* his disciples: and of them he chose twelve, whom also he named apostles;

LUKE 6:14

14 Simon, (whom he also named Peter,) and Andrew his brother, James and John, Philip and Bartholomew,

LUKE 6:15

15 Matthew and Thomas, James the *son* of Alphaeus, and Simon called Zelotes,

LUKE 6:16

16 And Judas *the brother* of James, and Judas Iscariot, which also was the traitor.

LUKE 6:17

17 And he came down with them, and stood in the plain, and the company of his disciples, and a great multitude of people out of all Judaea and Jerusalem, and from the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon, which came to hear him, and to be healed of their diseases;

LUKE 6:18

18 And they that were vexed with unclean spirits: and they were healed.

LUKE 6:19

19 And the whole multitude sought to touch him: for there went virtue out of him, and healed *them* all.

LUKE 6:20

20 ¶ And he lifted up his eyes on his disciples, and said, *\_Blessed be ye \_poor: for \_yours is the \_kingdom of \_God.*

LUKE 6:21

21 *\_Blessed are ye that \_hunger \_now: for ye shall be \_filled. \_Blessed are ye that \_weep \_now: for ye shall \_laugh.*

## LUKE 6:22

22 \_Blessed are ye, \_when \_men shall \_hate you, and \_when they shall \_separate you *from their company*, and shall \_reproach you, and \_cast out \_your \_name as \_evil, for the \_Son of \_man's \_sake.

## LUKE 6:23

23 \_Rejoice ye in that \_day, and \_leap for joy: for, \_behold, \_your \_reward *is* \_great in \_heaven: for in the \_like manner \_did their \_fathers unto the \_prophets.

## LUKE 6:24

24 \_But \_woe unto you that are \_rich! for ye have \_received \_your \_consolation.

## LUKE 6:25

25 \_Woe unto you that are \_full! for ye shall \_hunger. \_Woe unto you that \_laugh \_now! for ye shall \_mourn and \_weep.

## LUKE 6:26

26 \_Woe unto you, \_when \_all \_men shall \_speak \_well of you! for \_so \_did their \_fathers to the \_false \_prophets.

## LUKE 6:27

27 ¶ But I \_say unto you which \_hear, \_Love \_your \_enemies, \_do \_good to them \_which \_hate you,

## LUKE 6:28

28 \_Bless them that \_curse you, and \_pray for them which \_despitefully \_use you.

## LUKE 6:29

29 And unto him that \_smiteth thee \_on the *one* \_cheek \_offer \_also the \_other; and him that \_taketh \_away thy \_cloak \_forbid not *to take thy* \_coat \_also.

## LUKE 6:30

30 \_Give to \_every man that \_asketh of thee; and of him that \_taketh \_away thy \_goods \_ask *them* not \_again.

## LUKE 6:31

31 And as ye \_would that \_men should \_do to you, \_do ye \_also to them \_likewise.

## LUKE 6:32

32 For \_if ye \_love them which \_love you, \_what \_thank \_have ye? for \_sinners \_also \_love \_those that \_love them.

## LUKE 6:33

33 And if ye do good to them which do good to you, what thank have ye for sinners also do even the same.

LUKE 6:34

34 And if ye lend to them of whom ye hope to receive, what thank have ye? for sinners also lend to sinners, to receive as much again.

LUKE 6:35

35 But love ye your enemies, and do good, and lend, hoping for nothing again; and your reward shall be great, and ye shall be the children of the Highest: for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil.

LUKE 6:36

36 Be ye therefore merciful, as your Father also is merciful.

LUKE 6:37

37 ¶ Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven:

LUKE 6:38

38 Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again.

LUKE 6:39

39 And he spake a parable unto them, Can the blind lead the blind? shall they not both fall into the ditch?

LUKE 6:40

40 The disciple is not above his master: but every one that is perfect shall be as his master.

LUKE 6:41

41 And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but perceivest not the beam that is in thine own eye?

LUKE 6:42

42 Either how canst thou say to thy brother, Brother, let me pull out the mote that is in thine eye, when thou thyself beholdest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Thou hypocrite, cast out first the beam out of thine own eye, and then shalt thou see clearly to pull out the mote that is in thy brother's eye.

LUKE 6:43

43 For a \_good \_tree \_bringeth not \_forth \_corrupt \_fruit; \_neither doth a \_corrupt \_tree \_bring \_forth \_good \_fruit.

LUKE 6:44

44 For \_every \_tree is \_known by his \_own \_fruit. For of \_thorns men do not \_gather \_figs, \_nor of a \_bramble \_bush \_gather they \_grapes.

LUKE 6:45

45 A \_good \_man out of the \_good \_treasure of his \_heart \_bringeth \_forth that which is \_good; and an \_evil \_man out of the \_evil \_treasure of his \_heart \_bringeth \_forth that which is \_evil: for of the \_abundance of the \_heart his \_mouth \_speaketh.

LUKE 6:46

46 And \_why \_call ye me, \_Lord, \_Lord, and \_do not the things \_which I \_say?

LUKE 6:47

47 \_Whosoever \_cometh to me, and \_heareth my \_sayings, and \_doeth them, I will \_shew you to \_whom he is \_like:

LUKE 6:48

48 He is \_like a \_man \_which \_built an \_house, and \_dugged \_deep, and \_laid the \_foundation \_on a \_rock: and when the \_flood \_arose, the \_stream \_beat \_vehemently upon that \_house, and \_could not \_shake it: for it was \_founded upon a \_rock.

LUKE 6:49

49 But he that \_heareth, and \_doeth not, is \_like a \_man that \_without a \_foundation \_built an \_house upon the \_earth; \_against \_which the \_stream did \_beat \_vehemently, and \_immediately it \_fell; and the \_ruin of that \_house was \_great.
